WHO WE ARE

Feversham Education Trust is a not for profit organisation established in 2016 with the aim of providing outstanding education. The Trust has been borne out of the successes of Feversham Academy formerly Feversham College in Bradford, which has been rated outstanding by Ofsted since 2008, the School has also consistently been in the top 1% of performing schools in the country for a number of years and is a designated Teaching School. We currently operate an outstanding secondary school, a sponsored Academy and an outstanding nursery in Bradford and will be opening a new Girls' school in 2019.

OUR PROPOSAL

Our proposal, if we are successful is to open a new 600 placed 11-16 Girls' school which will open in September 2021 and accommodate 120 pupils in each year group. The school will initially open to just Year 7 pupils and continue to take 120 pupils in subsequent years until full capacity is reached in 2026. The school will be open to all pupils regardless of faith or no faith and will be inclusive of pupils with special educational needs.

Our proposal to open a single gender school is based upon research which demonstrates that pupils learn best in a single gender environment, two of the current top 3 performing schools in the country are single gender schools.

OUR SCHOOL WILL:

- Set high expectations of pupils in standards of achievement, behaviour and school attendance.
- Set standards of excellence in teaching and learning.
- Foster a caring and supportive environment for the pupils to develop spiritually, morally, academically and socially.
- Follow a broad and balanced curriculum offering traditional GCSEs
- Follow pathways (English Baccalaureate, Mathematics, Science, Humanities and Languages as well as other National Curriculum areas)
- Follow an extended school day to access an enriched curriculum.

OUR LEARNERS WILL:

- Attend an outstanding school where achievement is high as a result of outstanding teaching and learning.
- Have improved life chances with progression into education, employment or training at Year 11.
- Demonstrate exemplary behaviour and safety practises at all times.
- Have a strong sense of identity as individuals within a global community.
- Make a positive contribution to the community and wider society.
- Be confident resilient and emotionally intelligent.
- Have a strong spiritual, moral, social and cultural awareness


